4. FIRST AID MEASURES

10. STABILITY AND REACTIVITY

Aliphatic polyamines can produce exothermic reactions with epoxy resins which in large masses can cause runaway polymerization and charring of the reactants. Fumes and vapors from these thermal and chemical decompositions vary widely in

composition and toxicity. Do not breathe fumes.
